### Nominative

Pronounced /ǔ/ like what you say when you don't know the answer to a question

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-ae

### Genitive

Pronounced /ī/ as in "eye"

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-ae

### Dative

Pronounced /ī/ as in "eye"

-am

### Accusative

Pronounced /ǔm/ as in "yum"

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-ā

### Ablative

Pronounced /ah/ as in "Open your mouth and say aah."

## C1 W3, 4, 15, 16 Latin Noun Endings - Plural 1st Declension

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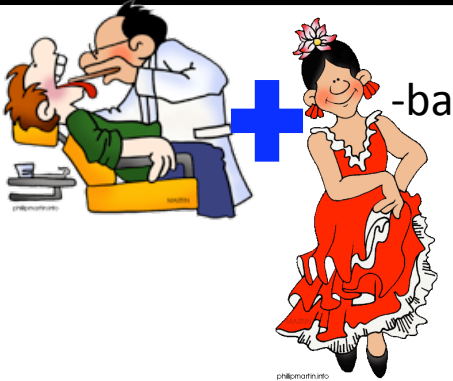

### Nominative

Pronounced /ī/ as in eye

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-ārum

### Genitive

Pronounced /ah/ - /rōom/ as in "Open your mouth and say aaah." and "rumba".

Tip: The u is pronounced /ōō/ as in rook or book.

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-īs

### Dative

Pronounced /ēs/ as in "geese"

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-ās

### Accusative

Pronounced /ahs/ as in moss

Tip: Say /ahs/, NOT /aws/

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-īs

### Ablative

Pronounced /ēs/ as in "geese"
